Thursday Night Lottery

Once again, the Thursday night thing is as popular as ever! By the time you receive this Newsletter, the Thursday Night Lottery application will be ready for you to print on our website!

Please read carefully through all our documents. As always, the Lottery is drawing for any Festival attendee who correctly submits an application for a Thursday night camp site.

It is totally random and we can assure you that no one is given preference. We typically receive about 300 applications for less than 100 spots!

Again, the reason you see folks in the same spot year after year is most likely that they are a VOLUNTEER and have a job to do early in the week or Thursday or Friday to make the Festival happen!!! We do place all our necessary Volunteers in campsites first, then we conduct the Lottery.

Camping

We are always looking at the best ways to make all Hiawathians fit into the campground at the Festival. This year, we will again enlist the help of our Campground Ushers (look for the **red aprons** on Friday when you arrive). They are placed around the campground to help each of you find a spot to put your tent or camper up.

Last year, we also employed our new motto of "Squeeze Please!" Please don't waste space with unnecessary vehicles. And please allow room for other Hiawathians by not having tents and campers circled 'round which wastes space too.

This year, we are also having a tiered system for camping tag prices.

- Tags for Tents, screen rooms, or large overhead tarps are \$25.
- Any camping unit up to 24 feet will be \$30.
- Any camping unit over 24 feet will be \$40.

(You do not include the camper tongue or towing package in the length of your camper.)

When you purchase tickets, you will to declare the length of your camper. During the weekend, if you are found to have an incorrect tag, you will be asked to upgrade to the appropriate tag.

volunteer information, coordinate shift times and the number of volunteers needed, and also maintain accurate records of past volunteers in order to communicate future festival needs. Celebrating 40 Years of Community Partnership

On April 28th the Hiawatha Music Co-op will team up with NMU to celebrate their 40th year by planting 40 trees in Northern's Outdoor Learning Areas. The event is a collaboration between the Hiawatha Music Co-op, Northern Michigan University's Sustainability Advisory Council, student leaders associated with GTU and EcoReps, and the Marquette County Conservation District. This effort was the brainchild of Doug Kitchel, who served on the Hiawatha Board of Directors for the past 6 years.

Professor Sarah Mittlefehldt, Co-Chair of Northern's Sustainability Advisory Council says, "When Doug asked if we'd be interested in helping with this project, it seemed to me that a tree planting was the perfect way to celebrate forty years of community partnership between the Hiawatha Music Co-Op and Northern Michigan University. It's a wonderful way to commemorate the past while also demonstrating our commitment to the future."

The trees will be purchased from the Marquette County Conservation District and will be planted in Northern's Outdoor Learning Areas. These spaces provide educational opportunities to teach students about the ecology and geology of our region. The forty trees will be mostly native trees, such as American sweet crab apple, elderberry, plum, and black cherry. Native trees were emphasized because they are better at supporting native insect and native bird species. Volunteers will also plant sugar maples and a few non-native fruit trees such as apples with the hope that future generations will be able to harvest the fruits of this collaborative effort.


