About

For more than 40 years, Hiawatha Music Co-op has served as an arts and cultural leader in the Upper Peninsula, providing access to a variety of traditional acoustic music[s] as well as Traditional dance genres.

Since 1979, Hiawatha has organized one of the most successful festivals in our region. Each July, it brings together more than 150 musicians and 3,800 individuals from across the Upper Peninsula and throughout the USA and other countries. The three-day Hiawatha Traditional Music Festival is one of the few festivals in the Upper Midwest that focuses on Folk and Traditional forms of music and arts.

To meet the growing demand for music in the region, the Hiawatha Music Co-op has created the Upper Peninsula's first traditional music community venue and space, "The Hiawatha Fold." "The Fold" allows seasoned musicians to mentor new musicians, share their art with the community and educate the public about traditional music. The naming of the Hiawatha space as the "The Fold" comes from the sentiment that we bring folks "into the fold" - a group of people with the same beliefs, welcoming others into a group, a metaphor for welcoming friendships, receiving folks, strangers, and established groups - based on their appreciation of Traditional music.

HMC also has expanded its offerings to include programming throughout the year, including such events as Hiawatha On TAP [traditional acoustic performances], Master Artist series, Yooper Uke Week, Winter Roots Festival, a "Fold" music series, virtual programming, as well as a series of music jam sessions.

Our Mission

The Hiawatha Music Non-Profit Corporation is organized exclusively to provide and promote traditional music and dance, educate and inform society on traditional American music and encourage the appreciation of such music through the facility of an annual traditional music Festival.

All operations are exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, and for the promotion of social welfare.

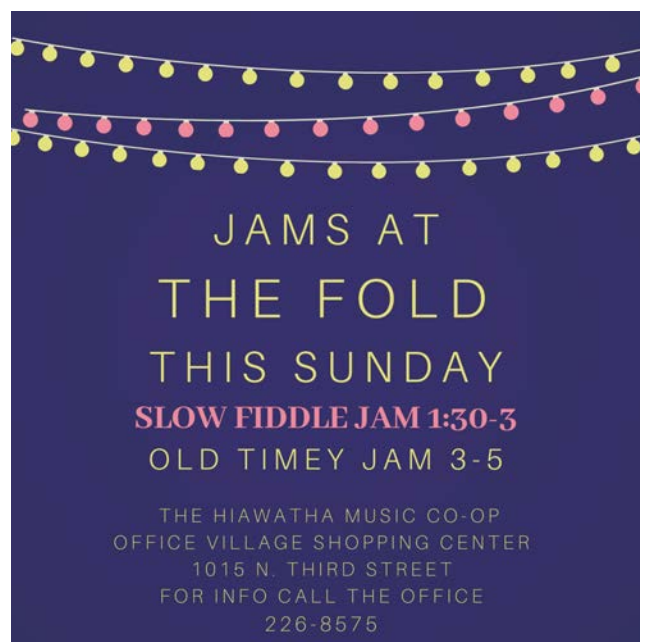
THE LIVE FESTIVAL RETURNS!!

Who would have predicted, four years ago, Hiawatha's big exciting news of 2022 would be that we held an outdoor music festival? It's said that absence makes the heart grow fonder. Perhaps that explains the absolute joy with which more than 4,000 thousand participants greeted the opening of the 42nd Annual Hiawatha Traditional Music Festival on July 22nd, 2022. One participant described walking down the lighted road into the festival as "magic." The weather was perfect. Beloved musicians from past festivals, like The Knockabouts and Troy Graham, were enthusiastically welcomed back. The musicians coming to the festival for the first time, like Dom Flemons and Chicago Farmer, were embraced by the warmth of the audience. By the time the children paraded [with their homemade instruments on Sunday afternoon], people were already making plans to return in 2023. Thank you, Frank Youngman for 25 years!



MAKING MUSIC TOGETHER

Hiawatha has always been more than a place where people listen to traditional music. It's also always been a place where musicians of all levels can get a chance to play together. The campfire jams at the July festival are legendary, but musicians need those opportunities more than once a year. Once the worst of the Covid shut down was over, the Hiawatha Fold on Third Street again provided a home for those get-togethers. Marquette's dedicated fiddle players met twice a month for "slow fiddle" jams to work on new tunes, and many of them returned on the other two weeks of the month to join the old-timey jams. The Marquette Ukulele Group also met once a month at the Fold.





Accomplishments

SUPPORTING TRADITIONAL MUSIC ALL YEAR ROUND

Hiawatha has two regular concert series featuring local and regional artists. In 2022, the Hiawatha on Tap concerts at the Ore Dock Brewing Company began the year with some hiccups, as COVID required some rescheduling. However, the performers and audiences persevered to enjoy highlights such as a Jimmy Rogers tribute concert with John Gillette and Sarah Mittlefehldt featuring a yodeling contest and the always popular “Papa Crow,” [aka Hiawatha Board member Jeff Krebs] in a children’s concert.



The Live at the Fold concerts were reimagined in 2022 to take more advantage of the comfortable space at the Hiawatha offices, a/k/a “The Fold.” The room was set up not only with the usual couches and chairs, but also with tables and soft lighting to create a cabaret experience. The first performers in the new space were Beechgrove and Blacksmith. An earlier LATF concert featured the Watts family, in one of the last performances by Marquette’s beloved Phil Watts. Hiawatha has since named its Old-Timey jams after Phil.

ENSURING THAT “HAPPY HIAWATHA” IS FOR EVERYONE

HMC’s annual music festivals have always featured a diversity of both performers and traditions. The Migiziikwe Eagle Spirit Dancers not only performed during the festival, but also led Native American dance workshops for every age group--teens, tweens, and children. Dom Fleming, a Grammy-winning Black artist, was featured on the main stage both Saturday and Sunday, participated in skills workshops, and presented a workshop on Black Cowboys and the Music of the American West.



We also asked our friends at SAIL--The Superior Alliance for Independent Living--to conduct an Americans with Disabilities Act review of our 2022 Festival. Their comprehensive report is guiding our efforts to ensure that the Festival, and all our programming, is accessible to a wide range of individuals with disabilities.





Accomplishments

COLLABORATING WITH OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

The four-day Winter Roots Festival in March is co-sponsored with NMU's Beaumier Heritage Center. In 2022, it included Finnish music for St. Urho's Day, Irish music on St. Patrick's Day, a songwriter's workshop, and a roof-raising concert with the Scottish Celtic folk-rock band Skerryvore.

Hiawatha opened Marquette Arts Week in June with a wonderful concert at the Presque Isle bandshell by Marquette native Tret Fure and The Driftless Revelers. The Co-op also provided the children's craft area and the children's parade closing out the week. Art Week is sponsored by the City of Marquette Office of Arts and Culture. Volunteers from Kohls Cares and the Superior Health Foundation also helped with the set-up, tear-down, and crafts.

Blackrocks Brewery not only provides performing opportunities for local musicians, but it also brews a limited edition beer or ale with a portion of the proceeds coming to HMC. In 2022, the Hiawatha Ale Release party on July 5th featured The Driftless Revelers. The Festival kick-off party on July 14th featured the Bluegrass band, Full Cord at the Ore Dock Brewing Company.



SUSTAINING OUR MISSION

Hiawatha is not just a not-for-profit, it is also a co-operative. More than 80 members of the co-op showed up for the November annual meeting, which featured a Finnish dance band, The Pasi Cats. The more than 150 Area Coordinators and Monitors who make the Festival happen each year are all members, as are most of the hundreds of other volunteers. The membership fees provide important sustaining income each year. In 2022, Hiawatha also established a new sustaining donor program, again as a way of providing steady income regardless of the vagaries of weather and pandemics.

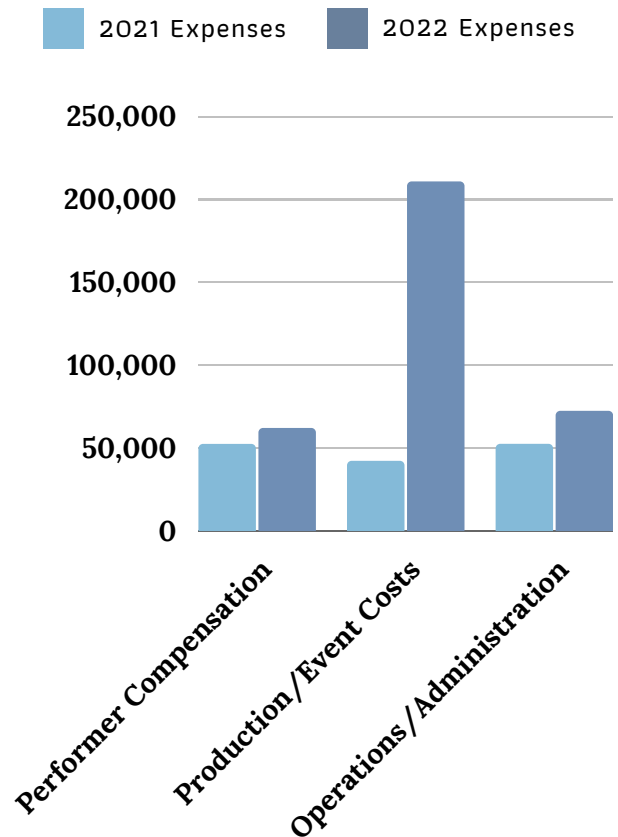

Financial Overview

Expenses based on Production, Performer & Operating Costs

The organization incurred expenses of \$344,387 for the 2022 fiscal year. Associated costs were general operations of The Hiawatha Fold, including rent and utilities, staffing, insurance, and office supplies. Additional expenses were for our year-round Events. Costs included performer fees, production fees, advertising, and Festival t-shirt printing and deposits on services for the 2023 Festival. Grant funding allowed for the purchase of anticipated electrical upgrade supplies.

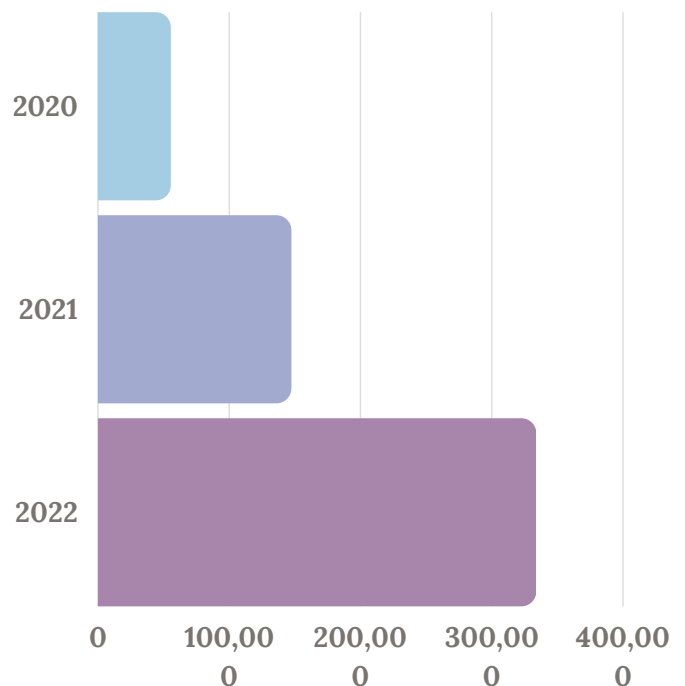


Three-year Expense Comparison (2020-2022)

An overview of expenses for the last three years is provided on the right. Total expenses were as follows: 2020 - \$54,990, 2021 - \$146,858, and 2022 - \$344,387.

The pandemic in 2020 and 2021 resulted in the cancellation of our annual Festival, thus a significant reduction in expenses. The increase in expenses in 2022 was a result of the return of our in-person Festival and other year-round events.

2019-2021 Three-Year Expense Comparison



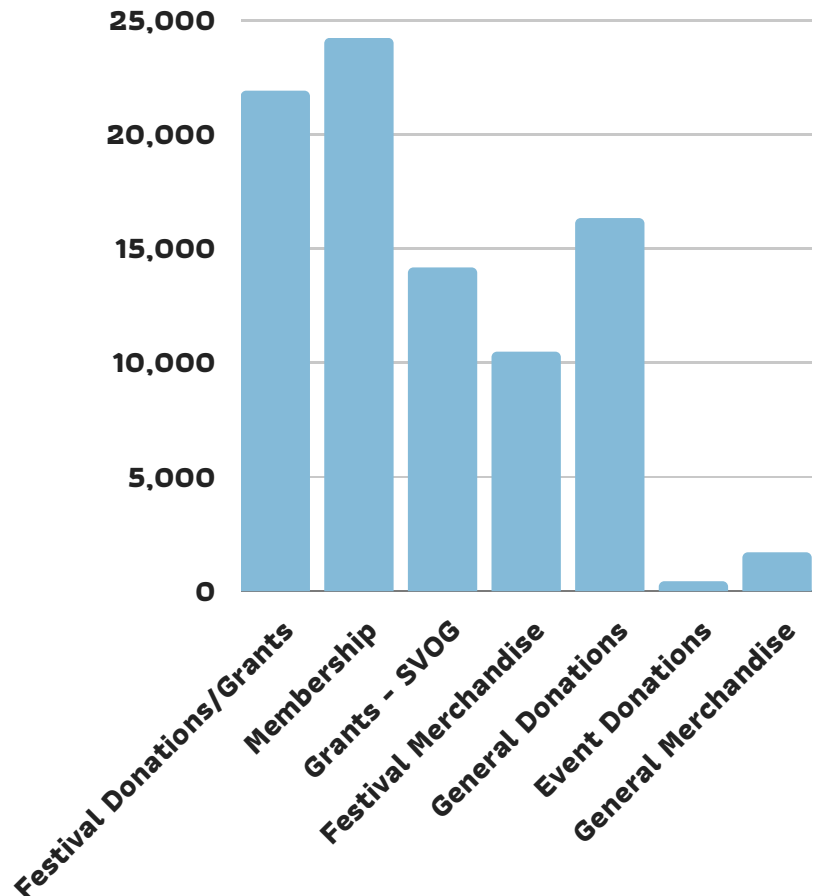
Financial Overview Continued

Revenue based on fundraising, donations, grant awards, and memberships

Total revenue was \$344,387 for the 2022 Fiscal Year. Primary revenue came from the return of our annual Festival. Festival Revenue from wristband, camping tag, and parking pass sales were \$171,053.

Vital revenue also was received through General Donations from Hiawatha Music Co-op supporters of \$16,302; Festival donations of \$10,452; Membership of \$24,193; merchandise Festival t-shirt sales of \$10,452. Grant funding carried over from 2021 awards from Michigan Arts and Culture Council \$14,030 and the Small Business Administration Shuttered Venue Operators Grant \$10,766.

2022 Revenue Breakdown

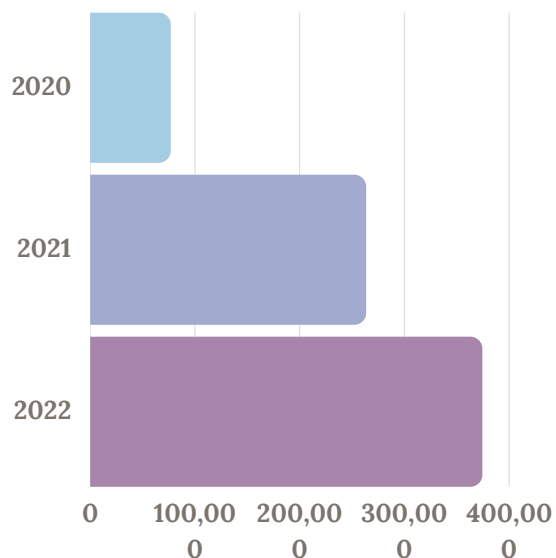


Three-year Revenue Comparison (2020-2022)

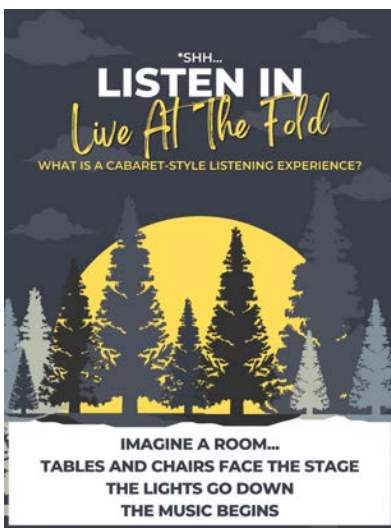

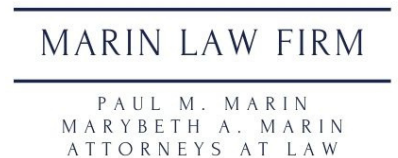
