Susan continues to contribute from afar, especially when we have painted ourselves into a tight corner. Stepping away from the Fold for a bit, the Events Committee is the driving force for events held at the Fold as well as in the community. Monthly HoTap [Hiawatha On Tap] concerts at the Ore Dock, Music on Third, Art Week concerts, plus many other events in the community throughout the year. They meet all year long and are creating great programs.

You may have heard we are recent proud owners of a [not] new semi trailer! Our old trailer was neither safe nor sound. Last year the brakes needed work just to get the trailer to the festival and after it was parked for the winter, a door hinge broke. Lee Ossenheimer stepped up and took care of the entire process of acquisition and disposal! So here we are.

Our first full-time employee, building rent and a [not] new semi are some of the rewards reaped from funding that has come through grants written for us by Heather Picotte and the grants team, who have done an amazing job helping us secure a variety of funding. But... [A big but here] that doesn't cover it all. The Festival generates income, some of the events do, some don't. Like everything else in this world, the more funding we have, the more we can do. Make sure your membership is up to date and if you have a few dollars to spare, maybe upgrade your membership or heck, just send us a check!

Onsite Ticket Sales Available in the Jacobetti Lot

As a reminder, tickets are available beginning at 8 AM on Friday, July 18th in the Jacobetti Parking Lot, across from the Tourist Park entrance. Tickets are not available at the Main or Back gates. Gates open at 1 PM on friday.

Parking & Shuttle Information Provided

There is no parking on the Festival Grounds except for those with Handicapped Tags or Plates and those who have purchased a \$125 Parking Permit. The Jacobetti Center [Career and Technology Center], on the Northern Michigan University [NMU] campus, opens for the lineup at 8 AM on Friday of the Festival. The lot, located across from Tourist Park on Sugar Loaf Ave., is open for weekend parking Friday through Sunday at Midnight. Please note that there is no parking on the grass - NMU will tow vehicles for parking in grassy areas. NMU has generously allowed us to use this lot; please help us to be good stewards by keeping things clean and avoiding parking in grassy areas so we can continue to use them.

Those wishing to come into town early can park overnight in Lot 14 starting on Thursday and move to the Jacobetti lot Friday morning (no more lining up for days ahead of time). The lineup begins Friday at 8 AM at the Jacobetti Center. HMC does not have designated parking at the Kaufman Sports Complex this year.

As a reminder, in addition to the Jacobetti Center, parking is available in two other areas: NMU Lot 22 - Take Wright Street/Sugarloaf Ave. roundabout northbound onto Sugarloaf Ave. Day and Overnight Parking available. Vehicles must be removed by Sunday at midnight. NMU Lot 14 - Take Wright Street/Sugar Loaf Ave. roundabout southbound onto Tracey Ave. NMU Lot 14 is just inside the NMU Campus on the left. Day and Overnight Parking available. Vehicles must be removed by Sunday at midnight. Festival Grounds Entrances are located at the 550 Gate (Hawley St.), Sugar Loaf Gate, or the Back Gate on Enterprise Drive. Walkers/Cyclists can enter at any of the three gates. Must have a wristband to enter. Handicap Parking is available on Festival grounds by Sugar Loaf Ave. entrance. Must have a handicap tag, plate, or special HMC parking pass. Directions will be provided onsite to the designated parking areas. Shuttle services are available from Checker Cab.

Let's Ride Safe! E-Bike Guidelines & Children's Bicycle Safety Training

Traditional bikes and e-bikes are always favorite options for getting from one place to another while at Festival! As a reminder, e-bikes are welcome on Festival grounds provided that the rider is 18 years of age or older and they strictly avoid the use of the throttle while on Tourist Park/Festival grounds. This will help keep extraneous noise to a minimum while ensuring the safety of walkers and other cyclists on park roads and paths.

HMC will again offer Bike Safety classes this year for children using their bikes on Festival grounds. Bring your helmet, bike, and watch for updates on bike safety sessions Friday, 6 PM & Saturday, 10 AM while at the Festival.

Medical Services and Emergency Response Guidelines

If you encounter a minor medical issue while at the Festival, HMC has a Medical Services Tent available to help! Located between concessions and the main stage, staffed with physicians and nurses, the Medical Services Tent is stocked with everyday medical supplies for your minor medical needs. If you encounter a medical emergency that requires an ambulance, please inform dispatch to have the ambulance use the Enterprise Gate (located next to Closner Construction at 2050 Enterprise St.) to gain the fastest access to the individual(s) in need of assistance.

Pet Guidelines Provided

To ensure the safety of Festival attendees as well as our beloved furry friends, HMC reminds Festival goers that only ADA Service Animals are approved/permitted on Festival grounds. Pets, emotional support animals, and therapy animals are not allowed.





HMC Receives Grant for Master Artist Series Michigan's Troubadour Neil Woodward to Perform


